The Walkthrough Audit empowers heritage property owners and managers to better understand how they can lower their carbon footprint and protect their building(s) against climate disasters. This guiding document educates historic building owners on how to both lower operation and maintenance costs and to recover quickly after unexpected natural disaster events.
